handicrafts. Ambiente, one of the oldest established well-known fairs held every year in the month of February at Frankfurt, Germany, is an important marketing medium for India, not only for Germany but for the entire European Union and other countries of the world. Amibiente, revolving around products for the table, kitchen, household, giving and decorating, as well as for home and furnishing accessories is visited by leading buyers from nearly all regions of the world. India has been participating in this fair on regular basis since many years.

This fair concluded its 2014 edition in February, after gathering 4724 exhibitors from 89 countries and 1,50,000 trade buyers from over 150 countries. This year, Japan was the partner country.

Mrs. Chatterji inaugurated the Indian thematic pavilion in the presence of Mr. Raveesh Kumar, Consul General of India, Frankfurt; Mr. Raj Manek, Managing Director, Messe Frankfurt Trade Fairs (India); and members of the delegation. They visited the Indian exhibitors as well as Master craft persons at the fair. The delegates could also see the product range on display, participation by 81 countries and the competition being given to Indian products.

India well represented with over 450 exhibitors

EPCH organized the Indian handicraft sector's participation in this fair with a thematic display, highlighting Indian capabilities in houseware and home products. This pavilion featured 18 member exporters besides 5 Master craft persons sponsored by the Office of DC(Handicrafts), for giving live demonstration of their crafts with a view to highlight Indian craftsmanship and to create interest of the trade visitors in Indian products. They were, Mr. Abdulrauf Abdulrazak Khatri (Hand Block Printing) from Kutch; Mr. Khalil Ahmed (Woolen Punja Durry) from Mirzapur; Mr. Muzzafar Ali (Pashmina Shawls from Srinagar; Ms. Neihunno Sorhie (artistic Weaving) from Kohima; and Mr. Shakir Ali (Miniature Painting) from Jaipur. Due to the extreme importance of Ambiente as a very effective marketing medium, 433 Indian companies from different regions of India, participated in this fair on an individual basis. Worth a mention here, is that out of the total 433 exhibitors, 159 were from Moradabad region alone.

Heimtextil (Frankfurt) is one of the largest shows organized in Europe, showcasing bed, bath & kitchen linen, curtains, carpets, beddings, blankets etc. and on similar lines a show is being planned in India. Secretary (Textiles) was keen to know about the scope of technical textiles and also desired Messe Frankfurt to have some kind of association with Ministry of Textiles with respect to their technical textiles show in Mumbai to provide exposure to Indian Technical Textiles.
