the contribution of handicraft artisans and exporters in the growth of MSME sector in West Bengal and other parts of India as well as the requirement of skill development in the sector. He said that there is huge potential of export of handicrafts from West Bengal hence issues like skill development, cluster development projects, design and product development needs are to be addressed in order to sustain the growth of the crafts from this State. He informed the participants about the ongoing skill development programmes of EPCH such as RPL - Recognition of Prior Learning under PMKVY scheme for the skill development of handicrafts



fraternity. He also requested the state skill development departments to organise such programmes, implement new policies, build CFCs, provide greater financial and infrastructure assistance to the Artisans, entrepreneurs, exporters and NGOs to promote growth of handicrafts from West Bengal.

RPL with Best in Class Employer, a new project of Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY 2.0) scheme under Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE) has been introduced by MSDE and National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC). MSDE and NSDC through this project type aims to ensure wider outreach to large workforce across all the Sectors in the country through direct partnership with Sector Skill Councils (SSCs).



As Handicrafts is an unorganised sector, artisans acquire their skills through informal channels such as family occupation resulting in their skills going unrecognised as they do not receive formal certification. In order to address the concern, **Export Promotion Council for Handicrafts (EPCH) in collaboration with Handicrafts and Carpet Sector Skill Council (HCSSC) initiated a drive** to assess and certify over 22,500 artisans across the country. From 5th to 28th February 2019, under RPL with Best in Class Project, 600 artisans were assessed in Jodhpur, Rajasthan by EPCH on the job role - Traditional Hand Embroiderer of Handicrafts and Carpet Sector Skill Council (HCSSC).

Moradabad is one of the major craft clusters of art metal ware and is known world over for its products with exquisite designs and craftsmanship. More than 22% of artisans from India live and work in Moradabad, a craft hub that substantially contributes to India's export basket for handicrafts. To further give impetus to this mega cluster, the initiative of organising an outreach programme was taken by Ministry of Textiles.
